





Nelson's Animal Safari







Fall Storytimes!

Storytime Series | 10-10:45am

Registration begins on Mondays 2 weeks before the start of a session for Milford residents; non-residents can register one week before date of first session.

Baby Fun | (Birth-17 months) Mondays 10am

Session 1: September 9, 16, 23

Session 2: October 7, 14, 21

Introduce your baby to rhymes, books, and music. Parents are a child's first teacher, so learn how to build your child's language skills. There will be time at the end of each session for playtime and socializing.

Toddlers | (18-35 months) Tuesdays 10am

Session 1: September 10, 17, 24

Session 2: October 8, 15, 22

Toddlers will experience short stories, movement songs, active rhymes, and fun parachute activities each week. Storytime will be followed by 25 minutes of playtime to allow for interaction with others.

Preschool | (3-5 year olds) Wednesdays 10am

Session 2: October 9, 16, 23

Children experience stories, songs, fingerplays, educational activities and sometimes a craft during this 45-minute program. For the listening portion of this storytime we ask that the caregiver remain in the youth department but not in the community room. Caregivers will be invited back in for activities/crafts.




The Faygo Book

Staffed by dedicated volunteers, store hours are similar to library hours. Monies from the store help fund not only library programming but also wish list items for the library.

The store carries many genres of fiction and nonfiction books for all ages. These include large print, self-help, travel, biography, home decor, woodwork/ remodeling, beautiful coffee table books and an entire section on sailing. There are also many children and young adult books. In addition there are DVDs, CDs, and audio books. Plus there are free donated magazines.

Specialty items include Bags by Mary Bajcz, CDs by Susan Heard, note cards by Diane Bowman, necklaces, and tooth fairy pillows. Books by local authors Carl Sams II, Laura Wolfe, Daniel William Heard, and T.M. McCarthy are available.

Consider donating gently used books, DVDs, CDs, or magazines. Children's books are always welcome. The only items graciously declined are text books, reference materials, encyclopedias, VHS tapes, and old musty smelly books. PLEASE check any donations for family memorabilia. There is an unidentified picture wall in the bookstore.

Small donations can easily be made during bookstore hours but please call ahead with larger donations (more than 2 boxes). Someone can then meet you with a cart. Please call the library at 248-684-0845 option 5 or bookstore manager, Claire Marshall at 248-684-2262 to answer questions or to arrange a large donation.
